About Clínica HOPE

Clínica HOPE offers primary medical care to the vulnerable persons on the move in Ciudad Juárez through volunteer clinicians. Our aim is to ensure a respectful and safe migration journey by providing quality healthcare services and to build solidarity among medical professionals and those committed to human rights across our El Paso- Ciudad Juárez borderland community.

Purpose, Organizational Setting & Work Relationships

The Hope Border Institute is looking for committed, service-oriented individuals with a professional trajectory in the human rights and medical communities to provide critical support to our team of clinicians providing care to vulnerable persons on the move in Ciudad Juárez.

Our Health & Human Rights Interns will obtain first-hand experience in the provision of quality healthcare services through their support and assistance to our medical team, primarily in Ciudad Juárez, including coordinating scheduling, data entry, providing interpretation and offering transportation to clinicians providing services through Clinica HOPE. Interns will play a key role in facilitating work that contributes in a concrete way to leading the narrative on justice and forced displacement at the border.

Pre-clinical medical students, undergraduate students in a health program, social work students or students in similar programs are welcome to apply.

Interns must be able to legally cross as well as drive across the US-Mexico border with personal vehicles and must speak English and Spanish.

Continuing Responsibilities

- Coordinate clinician recruitment and scheduling for Clínica HOPE
- Provide weekend transportation to clinicians, including driving across US-Mexico border in personal vehicle
- Assist in data entry to support coordination of care for patients
- Provide interpretation (English-Spanish) as needed
- Assist in Clinica HOPE social media strategy

Requirements

- Interns must be able to legally cross as well as drive across the US-Mexico border with personal vehicles and
- English and Spanish required.
- All candidates must be able to pass a background check and participate in safe environment training

Stipend and timeframe

- This position is for 15 hours per week and offers a stipend of \$12 per hour
- We would like to hire someone to begin work as soon as possible and to hold the position through mid-December of 2024
